Comprehensive Approach to Career Fulfillment through GITAM Career Guidance Centre (GCGC)

Obj: To enable every student to fulfill her or his dream career choice

GCGC is a new strategic Center at GITAM with the mission to Mentor, guide, and prepare every student of GITAM into becoming a well-rounded professional and an empathetic human being, ready to step into her or his chosen career, equipped with competence, confidence and character. It augments classroom education with training in career-specific skills and in human values. It helps in the holistic development of a student and prepares them to be ready for their careers as they graduate. The career paths being offered include Campus Placements, Higher Studies (Abroad/ India), Competitive examinations including GATE & UPSC, Govt Services, Entrepreneurship, and family business.

The New Normal which came into existence due to pandemic has altered Higher Education irrevocably. GITAM in its efforts to convert the challenge into an opportunity has implemented a series of strategic initiatives to overcome the obstacles brought in by the pandemic. Complete shutting down of the campuses, Zero campus Drives/ recruitment processes, technical challenges in Online Drives, challenges related to remote supervision of Career Fulfillment activities, disinterest from the student community due to excessive online pedagogy are few of the major challenges which the GCGC faced/ continues to face. Title of the Practice:
