Tribal Women Empowerment through Entrepreneurship.



Tribal women to get trained in multiple skills



The Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India, has granted a project worth Rs. 72.7 lakhs to Dr. **Sowmya Injeti**, Assistant Professor at the School of Technology & Dr. **Swathi Chikkala**, Assistant Professor in the Department of English. Their project, titled "Tribal Women Empowerment" focuses on creating livelihood opportunities in tribal hamlets of V. Madugula Mandal, Anakapalli District, Andhra Pradesh.

Headed by GITAM EECE Department Assistant Professor and principal investigator Sowmya Injeti, the Department of Science and Technology's project, taken up in collaboration with Arohan Tribal Society, aims at training tribal women in banana fibre waste extraction process and promotion of liquid bio-fertilisers, among others. Launching the project in the presence of Madugula MLA Bandaru Satyanarayana Murthy, the project principal investigator briefed that as part of the Technological Interventions for Tribal Empowerment, her team will train the tribal women which aids in turning agricultural waste into valuable resources, encouraging eco-friendly practices and enhancing livelihoods.

In line with it, foundation stone for two skill development centres at Kamkutam and Lovakothapalli at the mandal were laid. The facilities will aid in providing training to tribals in four villages, including Lovakothapalli, Lovakrishnapuram, Kamakutam and Gopulapalem.

GITAM (Deemed to be University) is pioneering a transformative approach to uplift the socio-economic conditions of the local Scheduled Tribe (ST) population in select villages of Andhra Pradesh. By establishing four (04) Science Technology and Innovation Hubs (GITAM STI Hubs), this prestigious educational institution is blending academic research and community service to create a platform that nurtures entrepreneurship and empowers the tribal youth, ultimately leading to a remarkable improvement in their overall lifestyle.

GITAM STI wins Rs 3.65 cr grant for Tribal development plan in Andhra Pradesh's Alluri Sitarama Raju District

Four business units to be set up, each of which will initiate economic enterprises such as Niger Seed Oil Mill Units, Honey Processing Units, Solar Based Cold Storage Units, and Vegetable Processing Units

The overall goal of the STI Hub is to improve the livelihood of small and marginalised tribal communities and help with skill development through the formation of 2 FPOs (Farmer Producer Organisation) and 20 SHGs (Self Help Group) reaching out to 1000 beneficiaries. It also aims at creating value chains through Science and Technology Interventions and the develop social enterprises. The activity will help improve the physical and human capitals of selected beneficiaries as well as lead to improvement in the health and nutritional status of the tribals.
