Introduction:

Sustainable Development Goal 1 aims to end poverty in all its forms everywhere. GITAM University is committed to contributing towards this goal through its research, educational programs, its operations and its partnerships with government and non-governmental organisations. GITAM University is dedicated to making significant strides towards achieving SDG1.

Research:

☞ Research Publications in Scopus Index: GITAM has a relative activity index of 0.54 in its Scopus indexed publications relating to SDG1 during the reference period of 2021-2023.

☞ Projects:

GITAM is supported by Department of Science and Technology (DST) in establishing Four (4) Community Resilience Resource Centres (CRRC) in Rural Mandals in the State of Andhra Pradesh Viz., V. Madugula Block, Cheedikada Block, Anakapalli District and G. Madugula Block, Paderu Block, Alluri Sitarama Raju District. These centers are actively engaged in creating ability of a community to prepare for hazards, adapt to changing conditions, and recover from disruptions. It's based on four primary sets of adaptive capacities: economic development, social capital, information and communication, and community competence

Education:

☞ Contribution towards imparting and igniting the young minds on the aspect of poverty. In the Post-Graduate program of Masters in Economics, one of the expected outcome of program is to understand, estimate and offer the solutions for poverty reduction.

☞ ***Master's students carry out their dissertation on the issues of poverty reduction as a part of their course work.***

1. Scholarship Programs:

- ❖ GITAM University has established various scholarship schemes for economically disadvantaged students. These include merit-based scholarships, need-based financial aid, and specific programs for marginalized communities.

3. GITAM President's Merit Scholarship (GPMS) for International Students:

- ❖ Under this program international students who got qualified in the test and admitted will get 100% free education, along with one laptop and Ipod.

Progress:

- ☞ A 6.75 % of the national students are from Economically Weaker Section (EWS). The following are the statistics of EWS students during 2022-2023 total strength.

- ❖ The university has engaged in outreach initiatives aimed at supporting low-income communities. This includes educational workshops, skill development training, and health camps. In the month of September 2024, Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences and Research (GIMSR) organized a medical camp in association with India Youth for Society (IYFS), HUT Foundation, and Neolaia Centre for Global Health and Research. A total of 650 patients from nearby villages such as Jangalapalem, Neelakantapuram, Chikkalipeta, Rayavanipalem, Rajyipeta, Gurrampalem, Chintalapalem, and Old Pendurthi attended the camp.
